## Finances again

I have written in recent newsletters about the very tight financial situation that we find ourselves in this year, in common with many other schools. On Wednesday evening the Governors were able to set a budget for the new financial year – April 2018 to March 2019 – and so we are able to stay afloat for another year.

This has not been without a lot of angst and some difficult decisions, including this first black and white newsletter to save on printing costs. It is a coincidence that a government minister last week suggested that schools save money by photocopying less in colour.

We are aware that there has been talk on relaxing the public sector pay cap which has been in place for eight years now. This will be very welcome if it applies to teachers but if any pay award this year is not funded we will be looking for further savings as a result. Support staff have already had their pay award and it has not been funded.

Today we have the final house charity day of the year with Cambridge's Blue Day. It is a non-uniform day and tickets have again been sold in advance. Thank you to those who have organised

### KS3 exams

As mentioned in a previous newsletter KS3 exams start on 18 June 2018. For KS3 exams Maths, English, Science and French (Reading and Writing) will take place in the main exam hall and the rest will take place in normal lessons. Students have been e-mailed their exam timetable to tell them when these take place. Hard copies of Year 9 timetables have been issued today as Humanities PPEs will commence on 6 June. Years 7 and 8 will receive a hard copy of their timetable when we return after half term. Some subjects changed the dates of their PPEs to ensure a spread of exams for students and staff. The aim of the exams is to give staff and students an idea of current achievement and also to build up students' resilience in taking exams. The removal of coursework over recent years has meant that some Year 11 students have 25 or more exams for their GCSEs, so the more we can build our students from the start the better able they will be to cope with sitting public examinations.

Students have access to 1000s of resources on Doddle, and can use this as a starting point for their revision for all subjects. Teachers will also talk to students in lessons about suitable resources to support revision for their subjects.

Last week our Hearing Hub ran a number of events to raise deaf awareness in school. All students had the opportunity to learn British Sign Language during form time, and Mrs Helcoop even attempted it in Cambridge House Assembly! The Hub operated drop-in sessions every lunchtime with a focus on games linked to improving language and communication. We also screened the 'Silent Child' in the Dining Hall, which is an Oscar-winning short film about a young girl's attempts to learn to communicate through BSL and her family struggling to deal with her being deaf.

In addition a group of HI students went to Peterborough Tennis Club and took part in a deaf friendly tennis taster session; all had an amazing time and enjoyed the opportunity to try something new.

We were also pleased to formally recognise our two new Hub Ambassadors in assemblies. Magdalena and Elise have contributed so much to our Hub and have also played an important role in hosting students from other schools and developing the work that we do. Congratulations to them both.
