Year 9 Holocaust Survivor Visit



Last Wednesday, a group of Year 9 history students had the opportunity to meet Holocaust survivor Harry Bibring, as part of the work with the Holocaust Educational Trust. During the morning Harry spoke of his experiences growing up in Austria during the 1920s and 1930s and how in 1938, he was separated from his parents to become part of the Kindertransport to England. When war broke out, Harry was evacuated to Peterborough so was very glad to be back in the city again. The talk that Harry gave was very interesting and moving, particularly when he spoke about how his parents perished in the Holocaust. Year 9 asked interesting questions, enjoyed looking at the artefacts that Harry brought in and gained a lot from this experience. Miss Cox
