#### **School Games Silver Mark Award**

We are delighted to announce that we have achieved the School Games Silver Mark Award for the 2017/18 academic year.



The School Games Mark is a Government led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognized for our success.

Our sporting achievements this year include:

As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas of participation, competition, workforce and clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded this year.

#### **Year 7 Reading Buddies**

Next week, a select group of Year 7s will begin the Reading Buddies programme, which takes place twice a week during registration in the Study Centre. Students will attend with a buddy from their form and focus on improving their reading fluency, by sharing a book and discussing its contents. This has previously been a very successful way of developing the reading skills of our younger students and we look forward to our new Year 7s being just as enthusiastic.

## **Study Centre Opening Times**

The Study Centre is open from 8.00am before school and again after school from 3.15-4.30pm, except on Fridays when it will close at 4.00pm. Students are expected to complete homework and independent study or reading. Students are supervised during this time and staff are on hand to support with learning. Any students who do not comply with our rules or expectations will not be permitted to use the facilities before and after school.

#### **Positive in Public**


Get Caught doing something positive in public!!
