

Examination Dates 2019

Students sitting GCSE and A level exams this summer will receive personal timetables but we have been asked to make clear that all students should be available to sit exams up to and including Wednesday 26 June. This is to enable exams to be rescheduled if necessary.

We have no control over the scheduling of exams as we are merely an examination centre for each separate board. It is not usually possible to pass an exam if one part is missed, for whatever reason, so it is important to check the individual timetables carefully.

St Josephine Bakhita Day

This event last Friday was very successful indeed. It was led by the Santa Marta Group and they were joined by a police officer from the Youth Offending Service talking about knife crime and someone from the Gangmasters and Labour Abuse Authority talking about how people are dragged into being trafficked. We also welcome Bishop Patrick Lynch and our own Bishop Alan.

Sixth Form students, who attended a series of workshops and then celebrated a liturgy with the two bishops, spoke very positively afterwards about the day. They said it was really eye-opening and taught them the signs to look out for:

It made me think about previous things I had noticed at a car wash. I had seen the signs but not realised what they meant; I do now.

It made me more aware of the organisations that can help young people deal with issues such as gang crime and knife violence. I now understand more that victims are exploited and targeted for a reason.

I now know that these issues are all around us but we don't see them. We see them in the movies but don't think of that as reality.

The Liturgy was very moving and included a stunning piece of drama from younger students. If you have a child in Years 10-13 please ask them about the day. Pictures from the day are on our website.






Harry Potter Day
