## Welcome back

Welcome to a new school year and I hope everybody had an enjoyable summer holiday. A special welcome to Year 7 and other students who are new to the school. It has been encouraging to see students returning to school ready and eager to learn over the past week and a half. Last week Year 7 enjoyed their induction day which gave them a chance to have the school to themselves for a day! Congratulations to Year 7 students in Rochester House who were the winners of the House competition last Wednesday.

## Exam Results

We were very pleased with our GCSE results again this year especially as there has been an 8% increase in the percentage of students achieving a Level 5 in English and Maths and a 9% increase for achieving a Level 4. We also had a 7% increase in the overall average attainment of students across eight subjects, which is a great achievement for students and staff. In addition, according to our internal analysis and compared to a large number of schools nationally, the progress our students made at GCSE is looking very strong indeed. Unfortunately, the official Progress 8 measure is not published until October. At A' Level our pass rate dropped slightly this year to 96% but the results still show an average grade of a C with nearly 50% of results at grade B or above. The best news as always is that all students who applied to university managed to get there and we have a much bigger Sixth Form this year. I'd like to congratulate students on their exam results and to thank all staff for their hard work in supporting them.

## A Bigger Sixth Form

Last year we increased our Post 16 admission number to 150 from 120 to cater for the increased demand for places. As a result, our Sixth Form is now the biggest year group in the school and we have had to adapt our Sixth Form study spaces to accommodate the numbers. We now have an airy open plan space which is our new Sixth Form centre. This allows students to study in peace and quiet when they have a study period in very pleasant surroundings.

## Year 7 Applications

Our waiting list this year for Year 7 is very long indeed and we are heavily oversubscribed. If your child is currently in Year 6 and a Baptised Catholic and you are going to apply to St John Fisher for a school place for next September can I remind you of the need to include your child's Baptism Certificate with the Supplementary Information Form (SIF) at the point of application and before the deadline. This is very important. I also want to remind all prospective parents of the need to fill in the SIF on both sides **IN FULL** when you apply. If applications are incomplete they are unlikely to be accepted and you may not get a place. In the event of over subscription which we are expecting again we apply our over subscription criteria which is published in our admissions policy. I will be visiting our feeder Primary

schools over the next three weeks to speak to Year 6 students and to hand out our school prospectus. We also have our Open week which includes an open evening on 1 October 2019 starting at 7pm and a number of organised opportunities for tours during the school day in the latter half of the week. ## New Staff

## Diocesan Formal Consultation is open for a new Catholic Primary school

A formal consultation has opened concerning our Diocese opening a new Voluntary Aided Catholic Primary school in Hampton East in 2022. The Government has already given its approval based on a needs analysis and approval is now needed from Peterborough City Council. The Diocese would like to hear from our wider community through this formal consultation process.
