



Theme of the week: Fragility of Freedom

This week we have been preparing for Holocaust Memorial Day by considering the theme selected for this year which is Fragility of Freedom. As usual, our students represented the school at the city's commemoration on Thursday 25 January with a drama production which was performed in the city centre. In school, we have focussed on scripture from Isaiah: 'He has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed and broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to prisoners...to comfort all who mourn' and prayed for all those who have or are still experiencing persecution. We have considered the Catholic Social Teaching of Peace and how we can actively spread peace in our own communities.

Beverley House Mass

On Wednesday, Beverley House gathered for their Mass celebrated by Fr Karol. Thank you to all who helped to prepare and take part in the Mass and to Fr Karol and Mrs Goodfellow. The school theme this year is Belonging and Beverley House chose to represent this theme through fruit on a tree. 
