## Theme of the week: Discernment

This week we have focussed on making good choices and been reminded of St Josephine Bakhita whose feast day was yesterday. St Josephine is the patron saint for those affected by modern slavery and trafficking. As a child, she was kidnapped and sold into slavery. She was sold five different times: the trauma made her



forget her given name and she was named 'Bakhita' which means 'fortunate' in Arabic. Since being declared a free woman, she performed many good works and was canonised in the year 2000. Making good choices can range from relatively small decisions to ones that could have a huge impact on ourselves or others. Making good choices on what we say and how we behave; making good choices to use the internet and social media responsibly; making the choice to contribute to Cambridge Charity Blue Day today either through giving up time to raise money or paying £1 to wear mufti.

As a school we are aware that the current cost of living is a concern for many of us. We are hoping to trial selling good quality second hand uniform 3 or 4 times a year. Obviously, it will take time for us to build up a good supply, so when these sales take place will be dependent on how much uniform is donated. Hopefully this will benefit lots of our students and we will be very grateful for any items.

#### Free School Meals

Is your child eligible for free school meals? We are keen to make sure they get the support they need, both short term with meals / vouchers but longer term in terms of schools support via the pupils premium. If you think you may be eligible please complete the form online at <a href="https://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals">www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals</a>. Claiming Free School Meals not only provides your child/children with a meal allowance each day of £2.70 but also brings in valuable additional funding to the school.

Your child is entitled to Free School Meals if you are in receipt of one of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).
