Webinar 'Perfect Personal Statement'

Year 12 parents are offered the chance to attend a webinar for students who intend to apply to university from September. This webinar will take place on Thursday 9th May 2024 between 7-8pm. It will last roughly 45 minutes with an opportunity to ask questions at the end. The topic is "Words that Wow-Crafting the Perfect Personal Statement" and will be delivered by Paul Hughes, founder of the Parent Guide to Post 16 as well as a 6th form tutor and lead UCAS tutor for 16 years. He has spent much of the last 5 years mentoring parents and their teens through the university application process.

The webinar will cover:

- · The key information that needs to go into each paragraph
- \cdot How to ensure you 'hook' the reader with your application
- · Common pitfalls to avoid
- · Top tips for having a polished statement
- \cdot What your teen could (should!) be doing now to prepare.
- · Why getting it finished (or VERY nearly finished) is so important to a good start to yr 13.
