St John Fisher and St Thomas More Feast Days

St John Fisher was an English Catholic bishop, cardinal and theologian and is honoured as a martyr and saint. St John Fisher introduced scholarships into education and was passionate about everyone having access to education. He was executed by order of Henry VIII for refusing to accept him as the supreme head of the Church of England and for upholding the Catholic Church's doctrine of papal supremacy. He was canonized by Pope Plus XI. St John Fisher reminds us of the importance of faith, education, and inclusivity.
