Cricket News

The under 13 and 15 boys have been competing in cricket competitions against schools across the city. Both teams have performed well. The Under 13 team played in the shield competition on Wednesday to compete for 4th place after just missing out on the finals event. In the game against Peterborough School the boys batted strongly scoring 66 runs. In reply a very strong bowling display limited Peterborough School to just 29 runs meaning the SJF Team won by 37 runs. We bowled accurately with good line and length to stifle the batting line up. Qasim Bhimani, Zain Zahid, Ghulam Shahzad, Areeb Ramzan and Hasnain Shafique being the main bowlers. This meant the team competed against Hampton Gardens in a 4th place play off. Hampton batted first, but again the fielders were outstanding in limiting them to 29 again. This meant we needed 30 to win. Zain Zahid and Hasnain did this comfortably, scoring boundaries to win after just 3 overs. A great win meaning that we finished 4th overall across the whole city.

The under 15s played their first matches on Tuesday in trying conditions. We had a very close game against Peterborough School, we needed 8 runs to win off the last 2 balls but achieved this thanks to poor fielding. We then played Hampton College, but the weather won with torrential rain coming down to halt proceedings. Previous results mean that the team has qualified for the finals which pitches them against Hampton College and TDA to see if we can come 1st across the city. A minimum of 3rd place is guaranteed. Well done to all players involved, some wonderful cricket has been played.
