RW Loosemore, the Creator of the St John Fisher Stone Bust

My Grandfather was born in Southampton on the 13 April 1894. At the age of 10 he won a 5 scholarship vear the Southampton School of Arts and Crafts. On the 7 April 1909 he entered into an Apprenticeship Agreement with the Southampton firm of Garett and Hayson where he was employed as a letter cutter in stone, marble and granite.

The family know that one of the projects on which Grandad worked was the Pilgrim Fathers Memorial in Southampton which was unveiled on 15 August 1913 by the then American Ambassador.

During WW1 Grandad served in the Royal Horse Artillery stationed in Egypt and on his return he worked for R Francis & Sons Ltd in Eastbourne. This Firm was awarded contracts by the Imperial War Graves Commission for headstones and larger memorials for erection throughout the far flung battlefields of WW1. The family hold a photo of Grandad working on a memorial to the unidentified soldiers who lost their lives during the war.


Focus Day: Year 13
