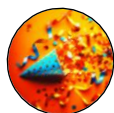
Theme: See the Good in One Another

Katharine of Aragon Mass

The Mass commemorated Katharine, once Queen of England, who is buried at the beautiful 12th Century Cathedral. She remained faithful to the Catholic church after King Henry VIII had their marriage annulled. Afterwards the congregation processed to her burial site with prayers of blessing led by Fr Karol and joined together to say the Angelus. The students enjoyed the experience of visiting the Cathedral to attend Mass and seeing where Katharine was buried. They represented our school with pride and professionalism.
