Tug of War

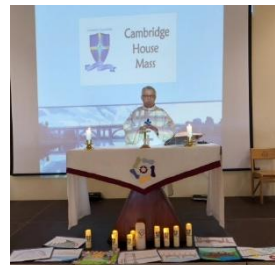
This week saw our Year 7-10 students take part in an Inter-House Competition, Tug of War. There were lots of competitors and spectators to cheer them on!
