# **Insight Explore**

On Wednesday, 6 students including myself went to Ferry Meadows to learn about nature and sustainability with the University of Cambridge Insight Programme. At the start of the day we looked at what was



biodiversity in different environments. We were given clipboards and sheets and told to infer which patch of ground would have more animals/bugs. We investigated by setting up pit ball traps with paper cups, tent pegs, and sheets of paper. In the classroom we learnt about sustainability from the Cambridge Zero Education Manager, Catrin Darsley, who taught us about how the world is slowly heating up because of climate change and how we can all help fight against it by living



sustainably. She also informed us about how to implement change into our lives. After lunch, was pond-dipping, each group was given a bucket, a rectangular tub, a magnifying glass, and a painting

palette, we went to the pond and used a fishing net to pick up whatever we could and empty it into the tub, we looked around with a magnifying glass for small creatures and put them into the paint palette for closer inspection. We did a tally of everything we caught and used our findings to figure out the water quality in Ferry Meadows. I enjoyed the trip and found it insightful, it taught me a lot about nature and ways to improve my way of life to benefit the world.
