Cognitive Ability Tests

Next week, Year 7 students will be sitting Cognitive Ability Tests (CATs). These are a type of baseline assessment which many schools use to assist in providing work that is at the right level for students. The test results can provide a snapshot of a child's potential, what they could achieve and how they learn best. The results can help teachers to set the right learning pace for each child, monitor their progress and identify areas where they might need extra support. They should be thought of more as tests of natural ability than of what they have learnt so far. For this reason, there is no need to practice or revise for the tests. The dates and times of the tests are shown below:

- Monday, 8 September Period 4
- Tuesday, 9 September Period I
- Tuesday, 9 September Period 3



Please ensure your child knows they need to bring a sharpened HB pencil and an eraser along to the tests.

Free School Meals

Is your child eligible for free school meals? We are keen to make sure they get the support they need, both short term with meals / vouchers but longer term in terms of schools support via the pupils premium. If you think you may be eligible please complete the form online at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals.



Claiming Free School Meals not only provides your child/children with a meal allowance each day of £2.70 but also brings in valuable additional funding to the school.

Are you entitled?

Your child is entitled to Free School Meals if you are in receipt of one of the following:

Income Support

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related **Employment** Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit

- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get). To apply for Free School Meals complete the Free School Meal Application Form on the website below www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals
