Careers Education is an important part of your child's development. At St John Fisher we have a variety of activities and support throughout the academic year. Students also have the opportunity to use the Unifrog platform within their PSHE lessons and outside of school. Unifrog is a universal destinations platform to provide students with impartial careers guidance and support their applications for post-school options, including university, apprenticeships, and work experience. All student have a username and log in for Unifrog and are encouraged to use the platform regularly in order to explore their career ideas. Year 7 will be introduced to careers during an assembly on 14 October.
